
The following CACFP At-Risk Meals trend analysis supports efforts to improve access and utilization of this important child nutrition program.

There was a 32% increase in sponsors and 172% increase in sites.



CACFP At-Risk Trends: Sponsors & Sites 2009-2010 through 2015-2016




Child Nutrition Index: Trends/CACFP At-Risk

CACFP At-Risk Trends: Snacks/Meals 2009-2010 through 2015-2016




Child Nutrition Index: Trends/CACFP At-Risk
